

# **Community Engagement**

This year's Community Engagement Report has come out!
This report details all our projects we've done throughout the year, such as Drug Take Back Day, our media campaigns, and our Early Conversations Training Kits.







End of SOR

After four years we have reached the end of our State Opioid Response (SOR) grant. This grant has allowed us to create amazing partnerships with organizations that serve the City of Rochester. It has also allowed us to fund a plethora of projects such as Child Care Council's Early Conversation Kits which trains child care providers and parents/caregivers on how to teach young children coping and resiliency skills. Child Care Council will continue to offer this training online for other child care facilities and parents that are interested. We produced four media campaigns that focused on home safety and starting early conversations with youth about substance safety. These are just a couple of the many successes we achieved with the SOR grant. A big THANK YOU to all committee members that helped throughout the five years of this grant!

# Calling All Artists in Irondequoit

Community Mural Design Contest for the Game Room in the Community Center



#### Final submission Date: October 18, 2023

Painting to be completed by anyone in the community interested in helping during the month of November 2023 on Saturdays and Sundays at the Community Center. Students from East, West and BK are welcome as well as adults within the community to assist in the painting.

#### Submission requirements:

- 1. Include in your artistic message- a sense of inclusivity for ALL youth in the Town of Irondequoit. There is more than one way to think of inclusivity....be open and think outside the box.
- 2. All art work must be non-political.
- 3.It may have words but they are not required. Wording should be something like Better Together, One Irondequoit, or other generic inclusive messaging.
- 4. The design space is roughly 8 x 11 feet of indoor space.
- 5. Send submissions via email to dfitogether@gmail.com
- 6. Subject line should read: Uplift Community Youth Mural 2023
- 7. Include your name, address, email address and phone number. If you are a student include your school and grade level.

## Submission and Selection Timeline:

- Contest submissions are due on or before October 18, 2023.
- Selection committee will convene during the week of October 23-31 and be comprised of persons from the Town of Irondequoit, Art Teachers, Uplift Irondequoit Coalition Members and students.
- Final selection will be announced by November 1, 2023.
- Painting will occur in November and December
- A final "unveiling/dedication" will take place in December 2023.

Winner of the contest will receive recognition with the final dedication of the mural and public recognition for this project. A \$100 cash prize will also be awarded to the final selection. We also ask that the winner be present for at least some of the painting process to ensure accuracy in how the design is portrayed.
